#### **Comic Relief**

#### **Funding Issues for Schools**

The Government is planning to introduce a new "National Funding Formula" for all schools from April 2018. This is now the subject of a **consultation** ending on the **22 March**.

Unfortunately, the impact of the planned changes will be to significantly **reduce** the money available to schools in Coventry. Almost all schools in Coventry including St Christopher will receive less funding from April 2018 if this goes ahead as proposed.

Headteachers and Governors are responding to the consultation. As a group of Headteachers we believe that it is important that you are made aware of this and have the opportunity to consider this and respond. Your voice is as important. The reality for schools is that we will have less resources to use in school. Our biggest resource is staff and the fact is that we will not be able to afford the same amount of staff we have now in the future. This will have a detrimental affect on the quality of education we can provide and the support we can offer.

Please support our school along with others in ensuring that we get the right outcomes for all Coventry children and young people to be able to continue to give them the best possible education.

You can respond to the consultation at the link below; however, we recognise this is complex and you may choose to express your views by making representation via your local MP.


