#### Sad news

I'm sure with the shocking event on Monday that your thoughts will be with other families across the country who have been horrendously affected. Please be assured that staff are advised on how to handle such a difficult issue with pupils appropriately.

Many of you may have also heard the upsetting news about Jordan Shields. Jordan was a pupil at St Christopher. He sadly lost his life at the weekend in Coventry - he was 18. I did not have the pleasure of being head teacher here when he was a pupil but I knew his parents and younger sister Aimee, who left fairly recently. Staff have spoken fondly of Jordan and we will look to remember him appropriately. I will send our condolences to the family from our school community.

#### **Sex and Relationships Education**

Along with this letter are documents explaining the overviews of lesson content after half term. The documents are very detailed and I made the decision to share as much as possible with you so that you are fully informed. Please take the time to read the documents through - particularly the section that explains the language that will be discussed and used in lessons. #### **Talk Topic**

Like all schools, we are constantly striving to improve the quality of children's writing. During a staff meeting we discussed how good talkers make good writers. Good talkers have a range of vocabulary and can speak in clear sentences using correct grammar. We are therefore trying to find more time to talk to children and use opportunities to develop talkers. For the next few weeks we will have a 'talk topic'. This week's talk topic is 'favourite food'. This generated lots of talk in assembly particularly when I shared my favourite take away! All staff across school have been encouraged to talk about food as a conversation starter at appropriate times. I've asked the children to find out about pupil and staff preferences and to tell each other about them.


