What a fantastic day! The children impressed us all on sports day not only with their sporting ability but also their motivation and support for each other. Thanks so much in particular to Mr Coyle for organising the day and to all of you for making the day such a great one with so many of you attending. We were very impressed with the participation and sporting talent amongst the parents too!

Year 6 Performance

Like our Year 2 children, Year 6 pupils were absolutely brilliant in their performance of 'Olivia'. The children were so confident with singing and acting for a wonderful audience. Well done Year 6!

Results

We are incredibly happy with the results the children have achieved in the national assessments pupils have had to complete right across school. We are particularly pleased with the Year 6 SATs results that took place in May. These results are used to measure school performance and we are held to account for them. Year 6 have exceeded our expectations and we have some of the best results the school have ever had. In comparison to other schools in Coventry and the rest of the country, our results sit between 15-20% higher than the average. Although results should not and do not define us as a school, I am absolutely delighted that we are comparing very favourably to other schools. It also confirms that as a school we are ensuring our pupils leave St Christopher with a good education in readiness for Secondary School and beyond. Well done Year 6 pupils and to all our staff.

SPORTS NEWS

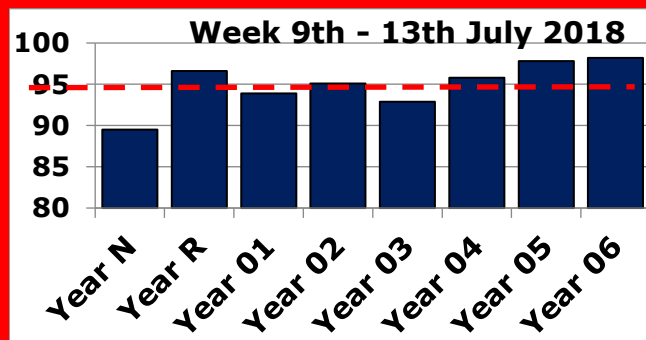
