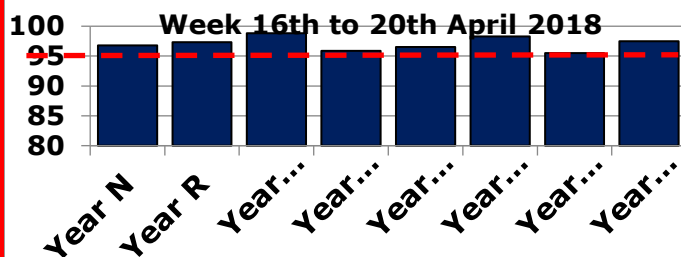

SPORTS NEWS

We played host to the Dave Moore Girls 7-a-side Football Finals Competition last Saturday. On a very warm morning, our girls competed against 4 other Primary schools in a bid to retain the trophy they won last year. The girls started off very brightly with a 6-0 win over Keresley Grange Primary which was then followed by a very tight game with Finham Primary which finished in a 0-0 draw. The girls then began to tire losing 2-0 to Christ the King Primary before being narrowly defeated by eventual winners Ernesford Grange Primary 2-1. Despite playing over an hour of almost continuous football, the girls battled away against the strongest girl's football teams in Coventry and came away with a medal for their third-place finish. Mr Coyle was very pleased and proud with their effort and resilience. The organisers were delighted with the facilities that we were able to offer as hosts and thanked Mr Coyle and Mr Scullion for their support.

On Saturday afternoon, Mr. Coyle took a group of our children to the Butts Park Arena to watch the newly crowned Rugby Union League 1 Champions Coventry take on second place Darlington. The children enjoyed a tour of the stadium led by some of the Coventry players, visiting the gym, trophy room, changing rooms before a Q&A with the players. They then formed a guard of honour as the teams came onto the pitch. The children were then able to sit with their parents (who enjoyed free tickets) to watch the first half before taking part in a TAG Rugby match on the Arena pitch while being watched by over 2000 people. It was a thrilling day out. One of the players leading our children stated to Mr Coyle that he had been leading tours all season and that the St. Christopher children were the best group he worked with in terms of aptitude, attitude, and sporting prowess. He added that they were able to do passing drills and games on the pitch that they haven't been able to do with any other school this year. We are incredibly proud.
