Golden Time Y1-Y6

The children have been working hard to keep their golden time this week. We have worked hard with staff and resources to offer the most exciting golden time activities that we can - influenced of course by the children. We have also tried to incorporate some new skills: *Animal and Cartoon Art, Retro Gaming, Cooking, Bootcamp, Cricket, Band, Watercolours, Fimo Clay Club, Puzzles and Lego, Chess and Board games, Dance and Zumba, Harry Potter Club and Origami!*

If persistent issues appear, then you may of course wish to have a conversation with class teacher.

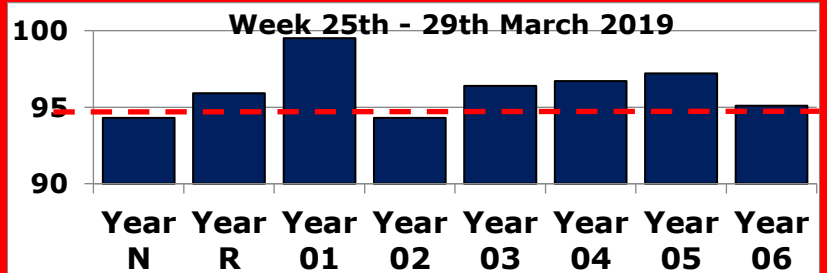
